Subject: Licensee Operations: Video Camera Coverage

The purpose of this technical advisory is to provide all licensees with guidance on the Office of Medical Cannabis's interpretation of 915 KAR 1:030, Section 7(1)(b); 915 KAR 1:040, Section 7(1)(b); 915 KAR 1:060, Section 11(1)(b); 915 KAR 1:070, Section 11(1)(b); and 915 KAR 1:080, Section 1(1) and Section 2(3) and how they may continue to maintain compliance with KRS Chapter 218B and 915 KAR Chapter 1.

Video Camera Coverage

The applicable administrative regulations contain video surveillance camera coverage requirements for all cannabis business licensees.

For example, 915 KAR 1:030, Section 7(1) states “[a] cultivator shall have security and surveillance systems, utilizing commercial-grade equipment, to prevent unauthorized entry and to prevent and detect an adverse loss. The security and surveillance systems shall include: ... (b) [a] professionally monitored security surveillance system that is operational twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week, and records all activity in images capable of clearly revealing facial detail. The security and surveillance system shall include: 1. [f]ixed camera placement that allows for a clear image of all individuals and activities in and around: (a) [a]ll limited access areas; (b) [a] room or area containing a security alarm and surveillance system storage device or equipment; (c) [e]ntrances to and exits from the facility. Entrances and exits shall be recorded from both indoor and outdoor vantage points; (d) [r]ooms with exterior windows, exterior walls, roof hatches, or skylights and storage rooms, including those that may contain medicinal cannabis and safes and excluding restrooms; and (e) [t]wenty (20) feet from the exterior of the perimeter of the facility.”

The Office of Medical Cannabis interprets the above language for cultivators and similar language for the other license types to **require all licensees to have complete and clear camera coverage of**

all areas where medical cannabis plants and/or material are housed, worked with, and/or transported through.
