

How To Guide for Kentucky Medical Cannabis Product Storage

Storing Medical Cannabis Products

Registered cardholders are allowed to possess and store the **standard supply** of medical cannabis in raw plant material or product format equivalency provided below:

Supply/Product	Raw Plant Material	Concentrates	THC-Infused	Non-Consumable (Topical)
30-day supply*	112 grams (4 ounces)	28 grams	3,900 milligrams	N/A
10-day supply	37.5 grams	9.5 grams	1,300 milligrams	N/A

*An authorized medical cannabis practitioner may increase or decrease the supply limit per product format in a qualified patient's written certification.

Registry ID cardholder type	Storage within a cardholder's residence
In-state qualified patient	30-day supply
Minor qualified patient	*Not allowed
Designated caregiver	30-day supply (per registered patient)
Visiting qualified patient	N/A

*Minor qualified patients cannot possess medical cannabis and may only use of medical cannabis with the assistance of their designated caregiver(s).

Types of Products

Inhalants



Inhalants include pen-style or handheld vaporizers with purified oil or powder cartridges. Both the vaporizer batteries and cartridges should be stored at room temperature.

Ingestibles



Ingestibles can include lozenges, sublingual tinctures, pills, oral syringes, and pastes. Follow storage instructions on the product label or packaging as these can take many product forms.

Edibles



Edibles are food items that must be food safety-certified including gummies, baked goods, chocolates, and drink powders. Follow specific storage instructions on the product label or packaging, including potential refrigeration.

Topicals



Topicals include lotions, oils, and dermal patches and likely should be stored at room temperature, away from direct sunlight.

Safety Tips

Kentucky Labeling Laws

Medical cannabis products can be mistaken for regular medications, tobacco products, foods, and beverages. Kentucky has strict labeling laws to warn when medical products contain medical cannabis.

How to Prevent Accidental Consumption

- ▶ Keep cannabis medications in the child-resistant packaging from the dispensary.
- ▶ Reseal medical cannabis products after use.
- ▶ Store and dispose of medical cannabis products where they cannot be easily seen or accessed by children or pets.
